Mount Holly Ghosts Feel Lucky to Return for another Haunted Holly Ghost Tour

Mount Holly, September 5, 2006

While some fear Friday the thirteenth, if you are a ghostly resident of historic Mount Holly, you may feel that is your lucky day. Last December, Main Street Mount Holly hosted its first Haunted Holly Ghost Tour, in conjunction with its annual Historic Weekend. The event was so successful, all 75 tickets were snatched up by anxious ghost hunters, leaving others disappointed to miss their chance to meet some of Mount Holly's past residents and visitors. So, the ghosts have been invited back every Friday the 13th to tell their tales about the other side of life in historic Mount Holly.

The first of the Friday the 13th Haunted Holly Ghost Tours will be this October. Tickets will be available at Red White and Brew and at the Main Street Mount Holly office. The cost will be \$10.00. Those brave enough to tempt the ghosts will gather at the Burlington County Community College on High Street at 6:30 pm for light refreshments prior to commencing the haunted tour. Ghostly sites along the tour include the Christmas Shop, the Thomas Budd House (now Uniquely Native), the Relief Fire Company, and of course, the very haunted Burlington County Prison Museum. The tour will conclude at the Mount Holly Library, often haunted by the ghost of a little girl who fell down the steps there.

All stops on the tour have been certified haunted by South Jersey Ghost Research, whose investigation brings them to town equipped with ghost-detecting regalia, including ghost-sensitive cameras, special audio recorders, electromagnetic field detectors and temperature sensing equipment. They have verified that the reported things that go bump in the night are more than just loose floorboards. SJGR has even identified historic Mount Holly as a "hotbed" of ghostly activity, with many other homes and business also deemed haunted. </P><P>This October 13 tour will conclude with a presentation by Jamie Faith Eachus, Assistant Director of South Jersey Ghost Research, who is also a certified Medium and Spiritual Teacher. Ms. Eachus, proprietor of The Ancient Healing Center, in Southern New Jersey with an office in New Hope, Pa., conducts private Angel Healing and Mediumship sessions as well as numerous workshops, seminars, and lectures to help people connect with the angelic realm and their loved ones that have crossed over. In this informative lecture, Jamie will discuss mediumship, life after death, and communicating with our loved ones on the other side. Audience questions and even possible random audience readings will conclude this presentation.
